



ANNUALS FOR SPECIAL USES

There is a "trouble spot" in every garden. The question is, "What can I plant there?" In an effort to rid your garden of "trouble spots," this list of annuals was developed so that plants can be chosen for a site which would be suitable for their growing needs. Many annuals have more than one use, so use them to your advantage! Also note: specific varieties may have characteristics different than those indicated.
