## **Seahorse Mobile**



Materials: Toilet paper roll (1 roll + 1 seahorse), pencil, scissor, string (yarn or fishing line ok) Color > crayons, marker, tempera or acrylic paint White or clear glue, small hole punch or awl, 6-12" stick, clothes pins, small clamps, or paper clips

1. Flatten the paper roll/s (1 roll = 1 seahorse)

2. Draw or trace the body parts onto the paper tube using the template.\*Be sure tp place the body parts onto the flattened paper tube in the exact spots on the folds like they are in the template !

- 3.Cut out the three body peices, (this may be difficult & adult help may be needed)
- 4. Draw in the eyes and go over the lines with black



5. Color all of the cut out body parts. Color the inside and outside with details only needed on the outside

6. Lay the dorsil fin next to the body with the folds meeting each other. Mark the width of the fin onto the body with your pencil. Cut a small slice out the size of your mark to fit in the dorsil fin

7. Slip the folded end of the dorsil fin into the slice cut out and place a dot of glue between them and clamp in place.

8. Place a dot of glue in between the two pieces of the tail and clamp.

9. Placea dot of glue on either side of the top part of the seahorse neck & attach the head. Place clamps onboth the tail and the head and LET DRY COMPLETELY!

10. Punch or poke a hole in the top back of the seahorse's head. Cut a, place of string. and push through the hole and tie a knot



11. Tie the other end of the string to a stick, leaving enough space between seahorses so they can dance freely.

12. Cut a piece of string several inches longer than your stick, Tie one end of the string to one end of the stick & the other end of the string to the other end of the stick, hang it up & enjoy!
